(1) BUSINESS ARISING FROM PREVIOUS MEETINGS:

Minutes of Meeting #131 were approved with no changes, motioned by Gordon Dalzell, seconded by Pam McNeil.

Update on Action #131-1 Saint John LNG to consider the committee's request regarding providing transportation to meetings if required under special circumstances

SJLNG is willing to provide transportation by means of a taxi if required. This will be arranged by the member contacting Fundy Engineering a few days prior to each meeting and SJLNG will arrange a prepaid taxi for the member(s).

Update on Action #131-2 Fundy Engineering to review previous CCELC minutes that made reference to Liquefaction updates

A list of liquefaction references were called out of the meeting minutes from 2019 to 2024. The list was sent out (mailed and emailed) with the last meeting package.

Update on Action #131-3 SJLNG to follow-up with upper management to confirm the following:

A. Are there any talks occurring regarding the prospects of a liquefaction Terminal? Are you in talks with John Herron?

There are no talks of a liquefaction terminal currently. John Herron was onsite in November to see if SJLNG seen any opportunities for business development. Currently there are no plans for further business development.

B. Is SJLNG talking with Trans Canada Energy regarding liquefaction?

No. In past years there was talks however the business case is not there.

C. Is SJLNG looking at supplying LNG or frack gas from SJ? to Europe?

No and No.

D. Is SJLNG talking to Wayne Long or Atlantica Energy about fracked gas or about LNG?

SJLNG is not in talks with anyone or any organization about fracked gas or LNG.

E. What is SJLNG thoughts on Bill C-5 (shorter timeframe to receive project permits)?

Even though the government is proposing shorter time frames to receive permits, public consultation and social license is a must and cannot be bypassed. In any case, and for the purpose of Repsol, we do not have currently any project that would require or use this bill.

One of the members questioned why the liquefaction project would not be feasible. Large or medium sized liquefaction at the Terminal would require significant upgrades. In addition, availability of natural gas is a big component, as well as long term sales contracts.

Gordon Dalzell suggested a member of the community made reference to liquefaction already occurring at the LNG Terminal. Gordon Oram responded indicating the condenser unit could be what the individual was referring to. This is part of the current operating process. The condenser

drum is 60% full of LNG, and the boil off gas (BOG) is mixed within, resulting in some liquefaction as the gas is cooled down.

(3) UPDATES

The following updates were provided by Gordon Oram:

- Busy at the site with the Boil Off Gas (BOG) Project still underway. Lots of preparation for the colder months ahead, including hoarding as temperatures drop.
- BOG Project is planned for start up end of June, with it being fully online 2-3 months after.
- Several safety officers are on site during the construction.
- Plant is 40-50% utilization currently, a result of temperature drops and market demand.
- Four, possibly five, ships are planned to berth before the end of the year. It is possible that additional ships will berth early in the New Year as well.
 - There was an increase in advance sales this year, and the colder weather has also resulted in an increased demand.
- Gordon Oram showed a drone video of the Boil Off Gas (BOG) Project progress. Currently, six liquefaction units are up. The power distribution centre is just getting started. As a result of some of the large equipment brought on site, some of the fencing was temporarily removed to allow access (wouldn't fit through the gate).

The following questions resulted from the update:

Q1. (David Thompson) Will SJLNG will be supplying gas to the proposed NB Power natural gas fired turbine?

A1. (Gordon Oram) No.

Q2. (Pam McNeil) Can members and public do a site visit upon the BOG Project completion?

Action 132-1: Provide a tour to members and resources, and possible other interested parties, once the Project is complete (likely September / October next year).

(4) NEW BUSINESS

Gordon Dalzel referenced the following points of interest:

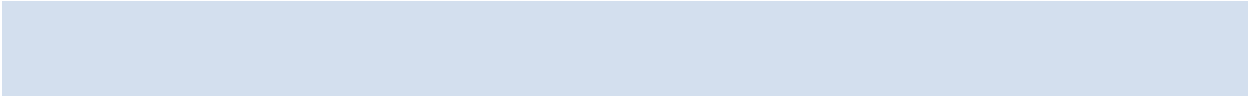
- "An Act Respecting A Healthy Environmental" Bill 23 is currently before the NB Legislation with 2nd reading scheduled for March 26th. If and when this bill gets passed into law on the third reading, it may have impact on the Saint John LNG Terminal.
- The Clean Air Act (NB) is currently being reviewed with a new revised Act expected to be introduced this spring in the NB Legislature. Included within will be a revised NB Air Quality Regulation that will see additional air pollutants added. Again, this revised Regulation could have some impact on the LNG Terminal.
- Activity is occurring at an old mining site, which neighbours the Saint John LNG Terminal property. Notification was provided to the New Brunswick Department of the Environment; however, they were unaware of any activity.
