(1) INTRODUCTION:

The meeting commenced with Sergio welcoming members.

(2) TOUR:

A bus tour of the Terminal was conducted showing all the main existing infrastructure (*i.e.*, jetty, LNG tanks, sedimentation basin, flare, processing, associated building, *etc.*), as well as the location of the proposed boil off gas liquefaction units. The bus made a few stops, including near the Jetty and at the Main Control Room, where guests were brought inside to view the controls and monitoring equipment.

(3) BUSINESS ARISING FROM PREVIOUS MEETINGS:

Minutes of Meeting #125 were approved with no changes, motioned by David Thompson, and seconded by Gordon Dalzell. All were in favour.

(4) UPDATES

The following updates were provided:

- No incidents or spills
- Terminal is undergoing regular summer maintenance activities (*i.e.*, painting, fire-proofing repairs, *etc*.)
- Experiencing some delays in the Boil Off Gas (BOG) Liquefaction Project (*i.e.,* long lead items, contractor availability, *etc.*). The physical work is expected to be begin mid-August.
- Undergoing fire response training for new BOG liquefaction equipment
- Next ship is not anticipated until November

A question was asked about propane leaks from the BOG liquefaction units. Sergio clarified the units themselves would not leak propane, but the refrigeration system would (fugitive), as is the case with any refrigeration system.
